MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding is signed between Department of Economics, Pragjyotish College, Economics Department Alumni Association (EDAA), Pragjyotish College, Guwahati-9 hereinafter, referred to as the party of the First Part and Charnuapara Village, Mandakata, North-Guwahati, Assam, referred to as the party of the Second Part on 8.03.2022.

Whereas, both the parties have agreed to collaborate with each other in undertaking joint activities in the village and aimed at to promote and develop the resources of the village (both physical and human), to educate, to guide and assist the people in their efforts to build up and expand their calibers and avenues and to serve with the basic village principles.

Now whereas, it is agreed between the parties that: -


1. The Department of Economics, Pragjyotish College in collaboration with Economics Department Alumni Association (EDAA), Pragjyotish College has adopted the village Chamuapara, Mandakata, North Guwahati from today onwards.
2. Both the parties shall assist each other in undertaking respective developmental activities.
3. The second party would help in providing associated support services like infrastructure, logistic etc. as on when required.
4. Both the parties shall undertake pertinent issues, in the areas as may be agreed upon and as may be beneficial for their respective target groups and / or joint initiatives.
5. Both the parties will also consult the Department of Economics prior to any activities related to the adopted village.
6. Both the parties shall suitably advise their respective affiliates/associates to undertake activities / measures as may be useful for promotion of activities of both the parties and / or joint activities.
7. Both the parties shall hold regular meetings for identifying the area of specific interest and reviewing the progress of the on-going activities.

The MOU is initially for a period of three years (3 years) and may be extended beyond three years by mutual consent of both the parties.

This MOU may be terminated by either party after giving 30 days' written notice of its intention to so terminate the MOU. However, notwithstanding the termination of the


MOU, both the parties shall continue to remain responsible for the respective obligations in respect of all the activities which might have already been undertaken prior to termination or then going-on.

Any dispute arising in the course of the MOU shall be settled amicably and as per the provision of arbitration Laws and shall be in the jurisdiction of Guwahati.

GUWAHATI, Feb 6: Rotary Club of Gauhati South in collaboration with Dr B Borooah Cancer Institute (BBCI) held a free health check-up and cancer awareness camp at Nabodoy Jatiya Vidyalay, Bahgara, Ganesh Kuwari at Siphajhar constituency on the occasion of World Cancer Day today.

The initiative has been supported by the Economics department of Pragjyotish College and its alumni association (Economics Department Alumni Association - EDAA). Bhabani Hazarika, counselor, BBCI spoke to

the school children about the importance of hand washing and better hygiene for better health. Dr Srabana Mishra Bhagawati of BBCI spoke to the adult and elderly population and asked them to desist from consuming gutho, tobacco, betel nut and other intoxicants. She further stated that if they observe any sudden loss of weight, anomalies in their body, persistent cough, etc., they should immediately consult the doctor and do accordingly.

Dr Ashique Iqbal of Downtown Hospital checked the patients. He was assisted by Nandita Singha, clinical instructor and Katur Borgehain of the same hospital. A total of

140 inmates of neighbouring villages Chomuaqara, Dui No Major Subba, Ek No Khanapara, Dui No Khanapara and Kuwari Gaon, were checked and given free medicines. Medicines were provided by Rotary Club of Gauhati South, EDAA, Pragjyotish College and Dr Paramananda Rajbongshi, MLA, Sipajhar.



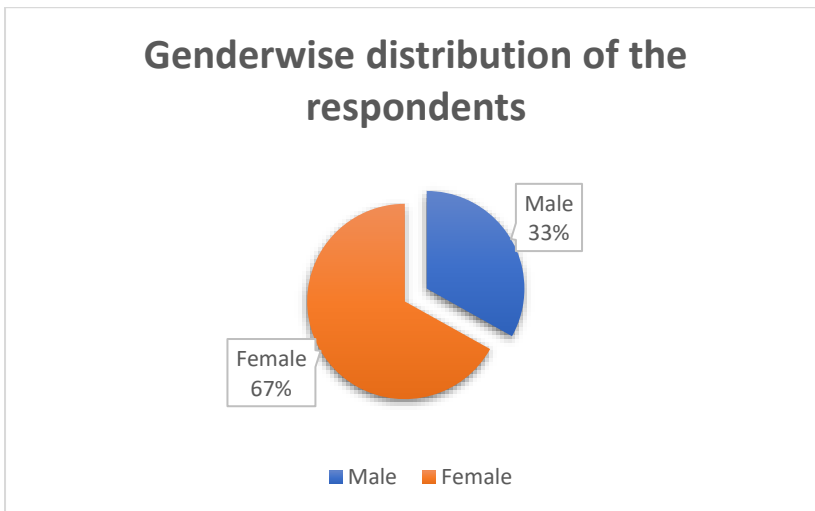

4.1 Demographic features of the sample

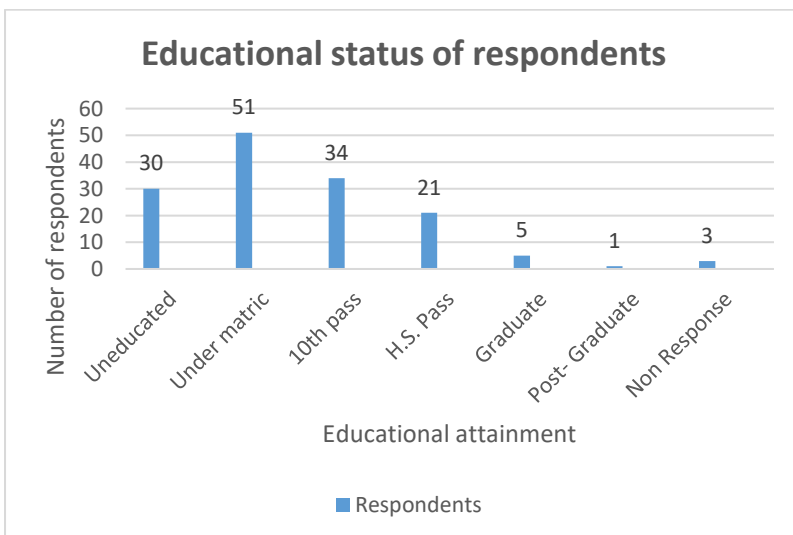
4.1.1 Gender wise distribution of the sample

Majority of the respondents (67%) are observed to be females with 33% male respondents.

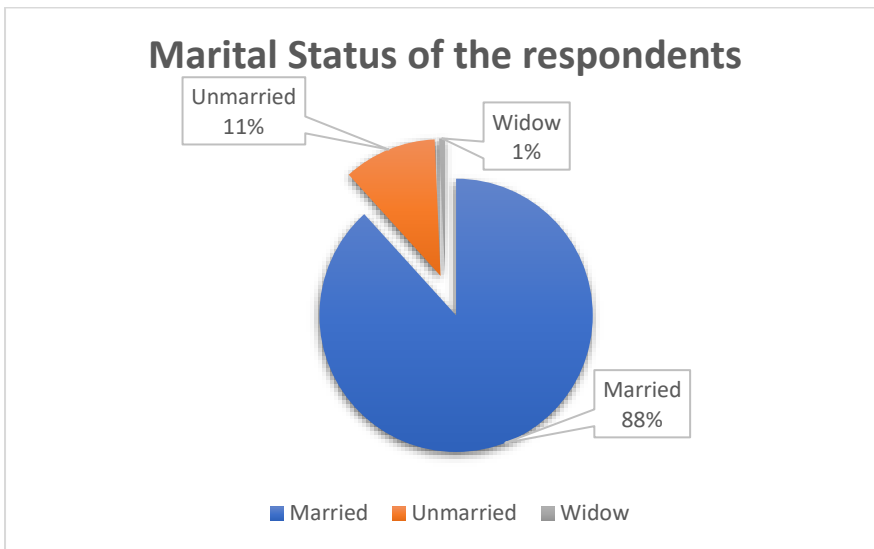
4.1.2 Educational status of respondents

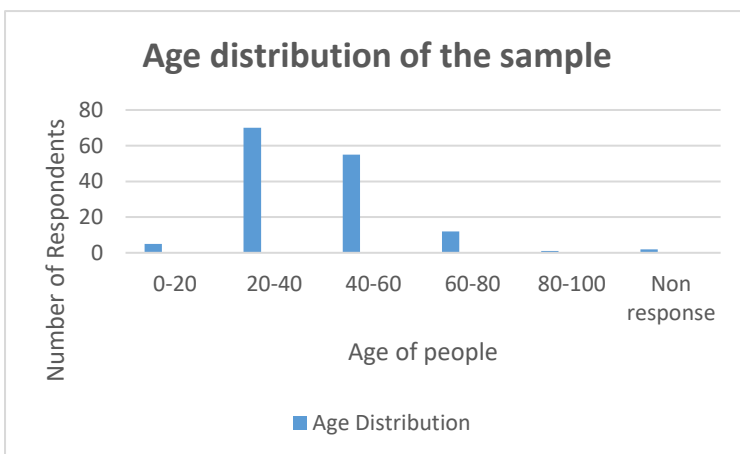
4.1.3 Marital Status of the respondents

It is observed that 88% of the respondents are married while 11% are unmarried with 1 % widow.

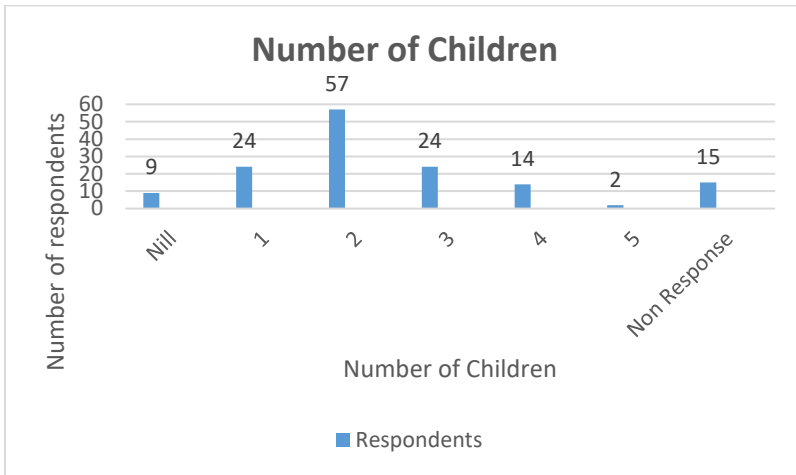
4.1.4 Age-wise distribution of the sample

It is observed that majority of the population falls in the age group of 15-64 and hence are a part of the demographic dividend of the country and state.

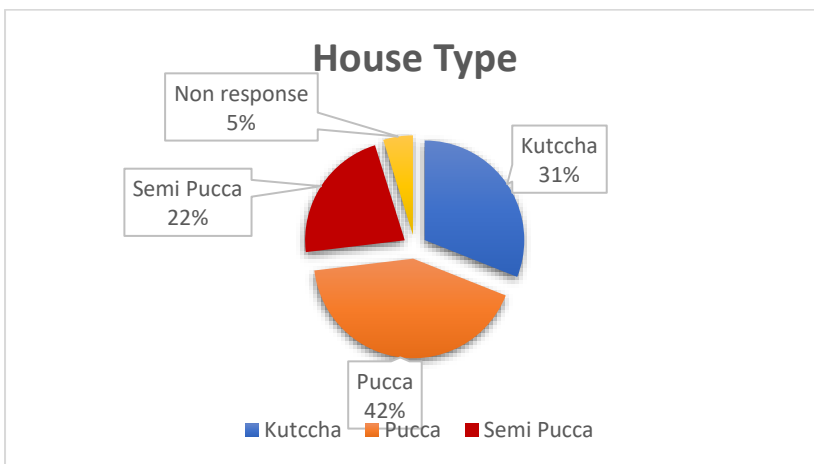
4.1.5 Number of children

4.1.6 Type of house

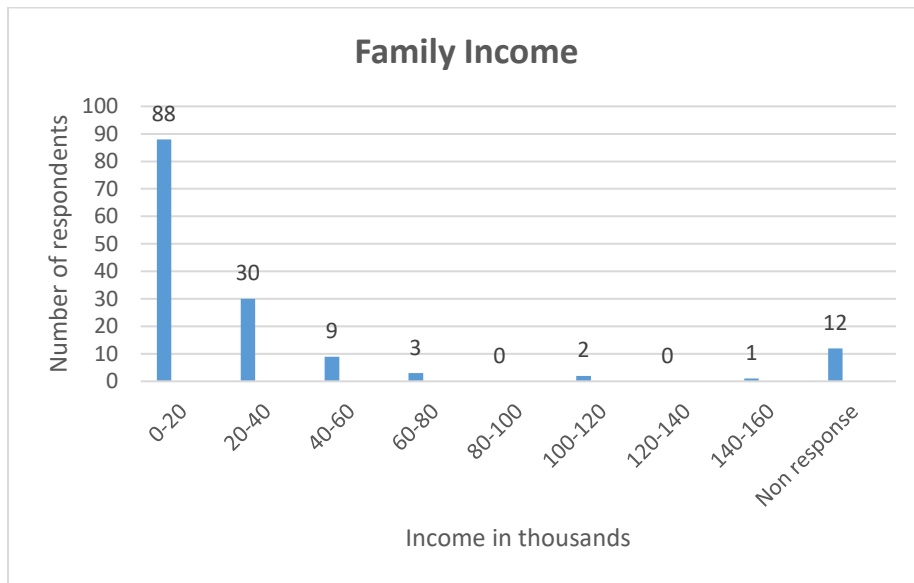

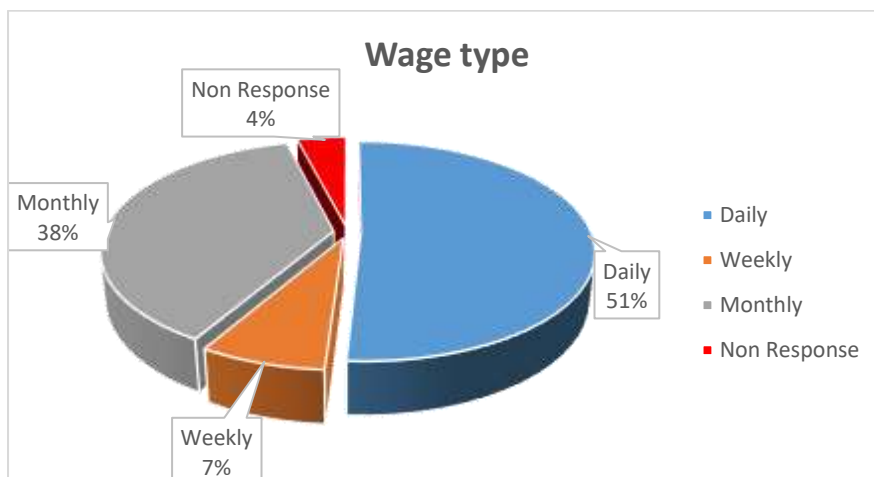

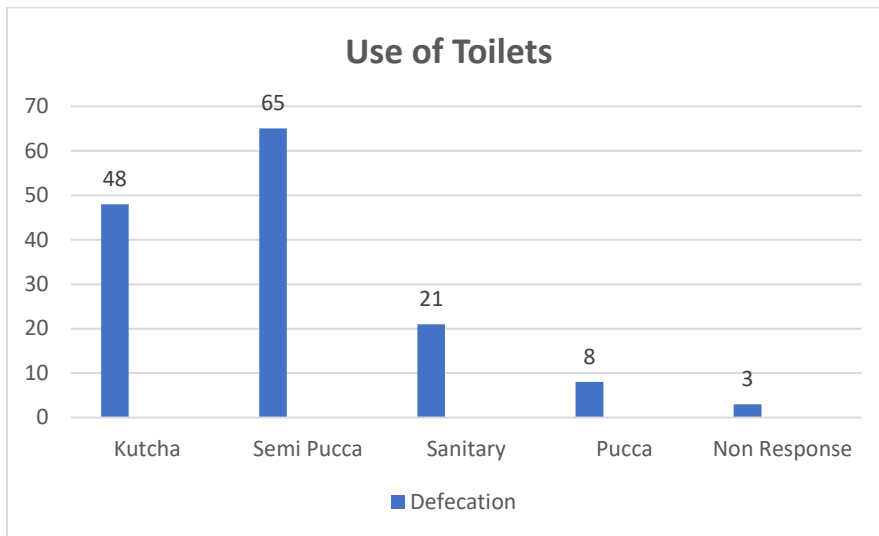

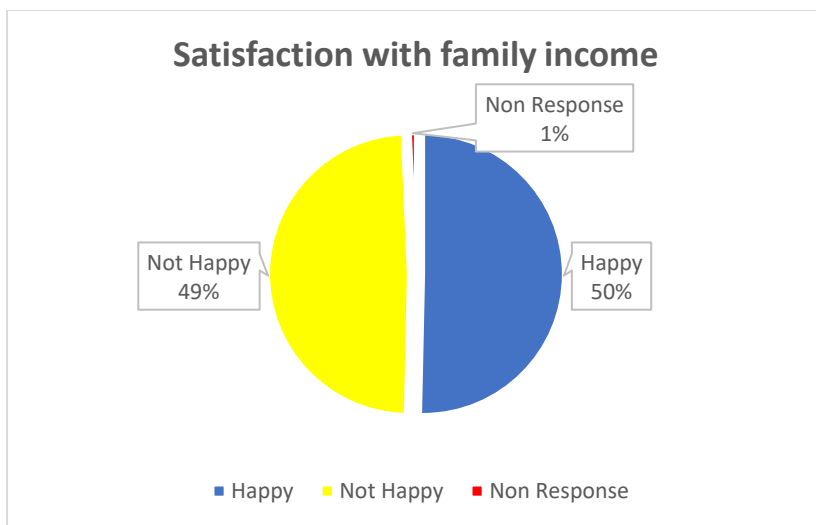

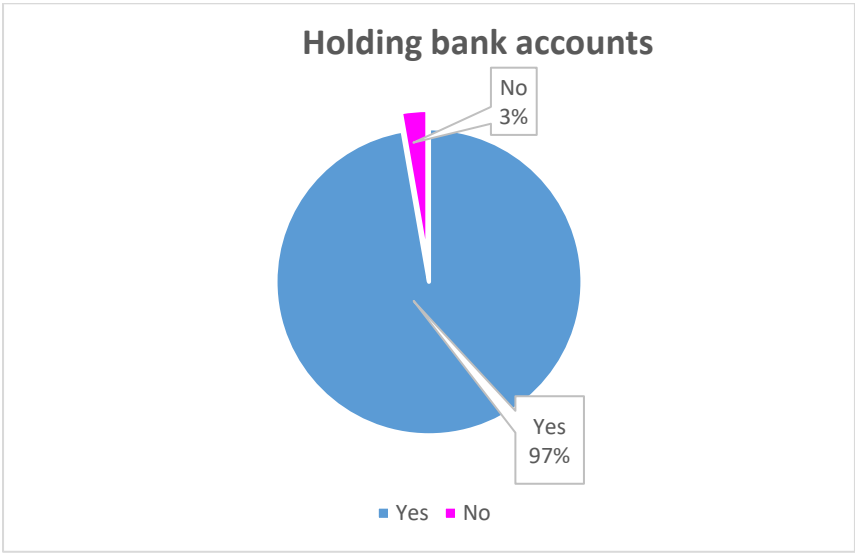

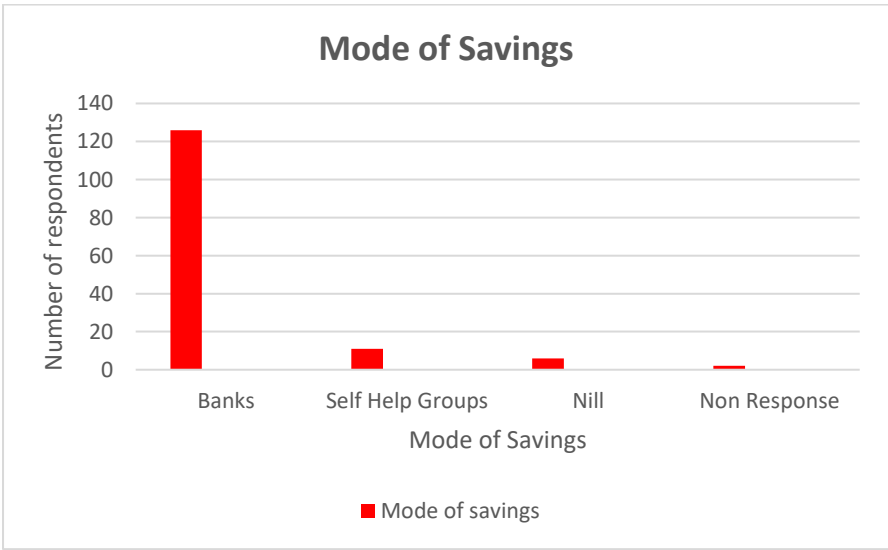

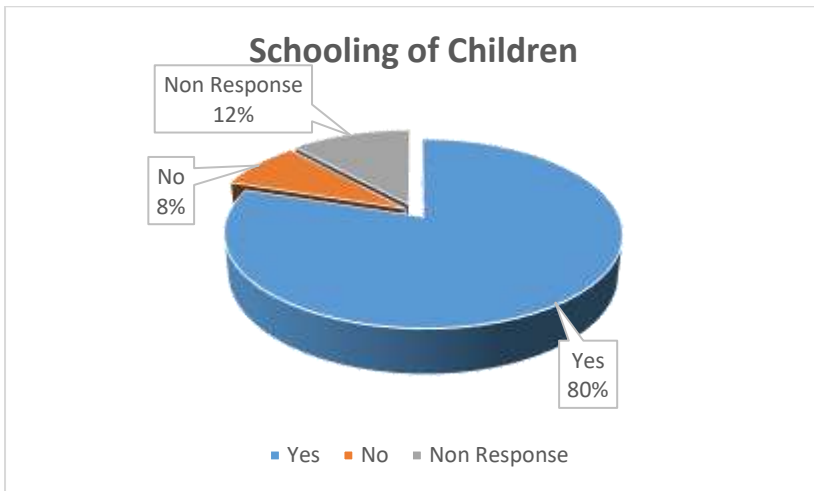

Interpretation: A majority of respondents (97%) holds a bank accounts. This show the connection of the people of the village with financial system.



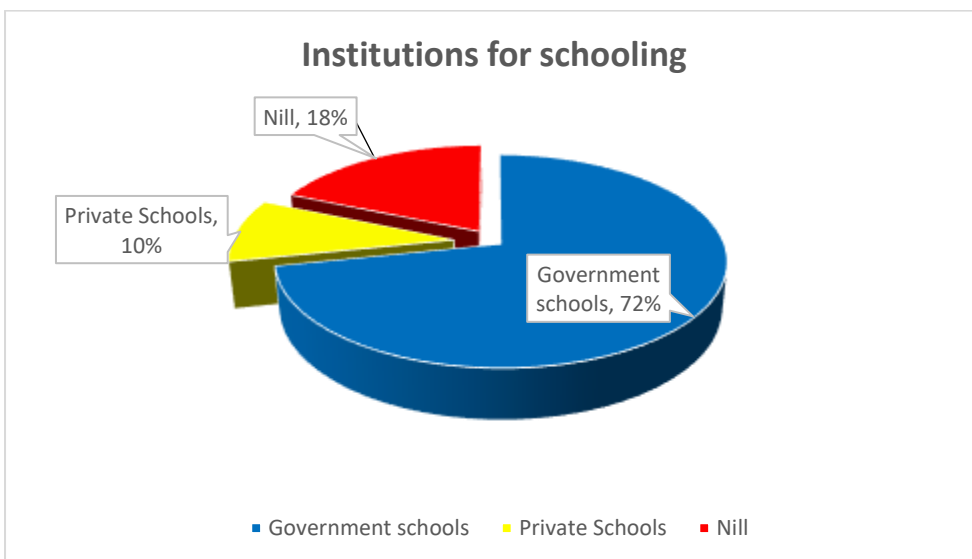

Banks are found to be the most preferred mode of savings. While self-help groups are the second best choice for savings.



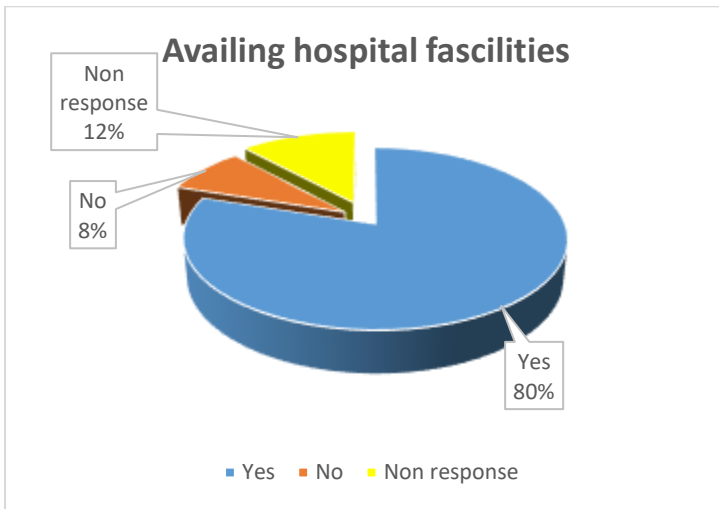

It is observed that majority of respondents (80%) provides schooling to their students. This shows that the people in the village value education.



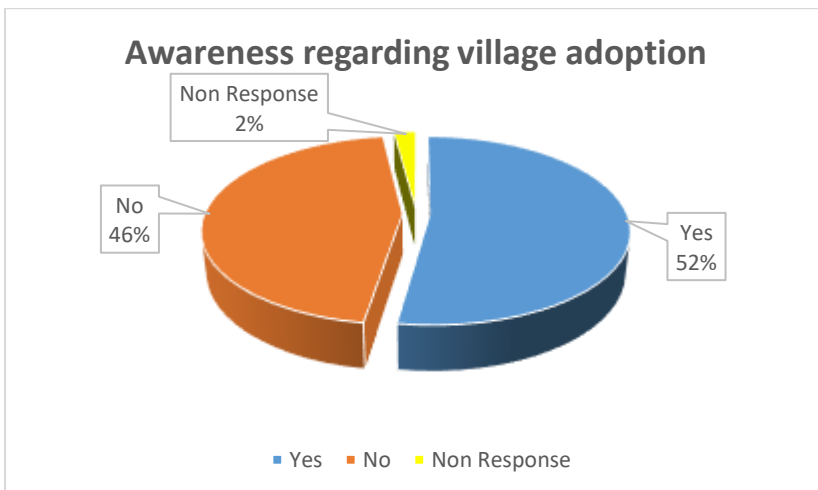

It is observed that most of the students (72%) learn in government schools, 18% of them do not attend schools while 10% of them go to private schools.



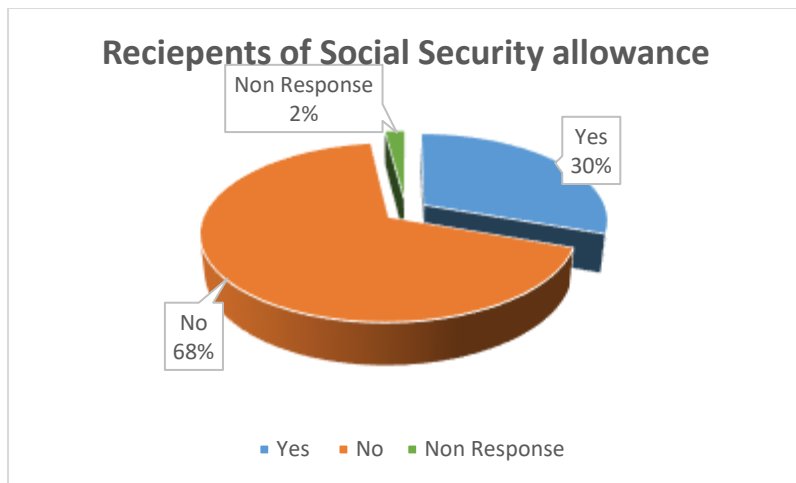

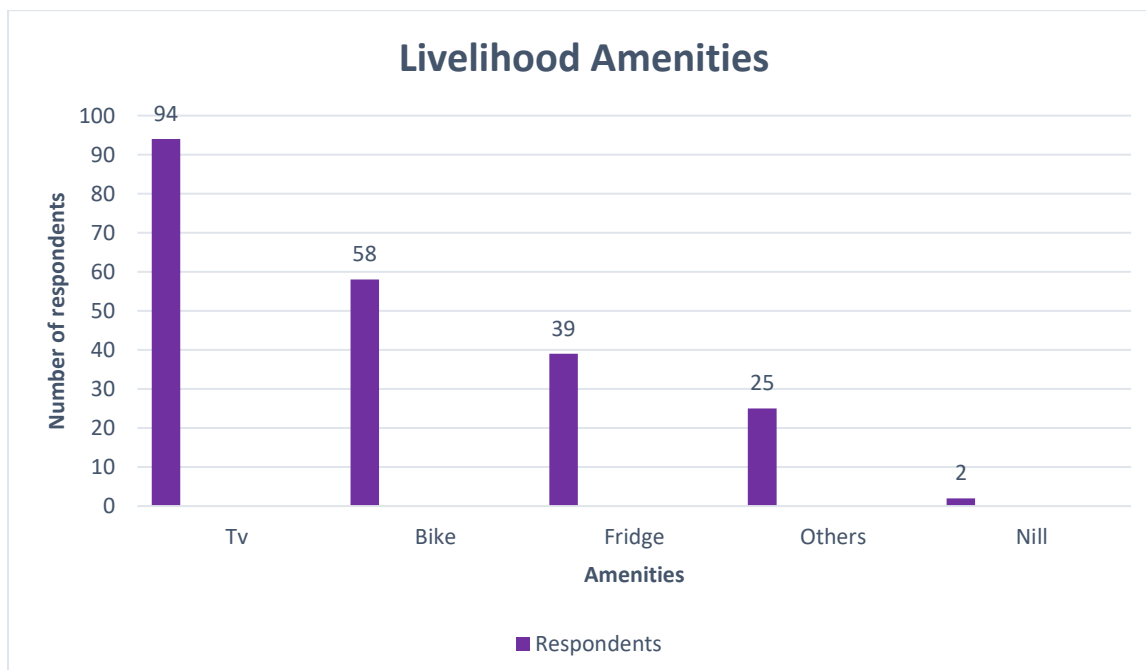

It is found that 94 respondents i.e. (64.82%) owns a TV, 58 (40%) of them owns a bike, 39 (26.89%) of them owns a fridge, while 25 (17.2%) of them owns other amenities. It is also found that 2 (1.37%) of the respondents doesn't own any such amenities.

Key findings of the survey:

- 1. The study finds that majority of the respondents have not attained higher education.**
- 2. Majority of that sample do not own a pucca house. Thus a need for provision of pucca houses or the awareness regarding government schemes of pucca houses is observed.**
- 3. It is observed that majority of the sample have more two or more than two children. This emphasized a need for the awareness regarding family planning and birth control measures.**
- 4. Most of the respondents use avail medical facilities when suffered with illness. This is a good sign as it ensures better health and a reduction of deaths and complications related.**
- 5. Most of the respondents are either daily wage workers or are weekly wage earners, hence do not have any stable income source. This highlights the need for skill development and career counselling in the village in order to increase the employability of the workers and increase their earning capacity.**
- 6. A major proportion of the sample has monthly income below ₹ 20,000. This might be due to lower skills or income opportunities.**
- 7. Majority of the villagers are observed to use either kutchha or semi- pucca toilets. Hence need for provision of pucca toilets is observed.**

Future Plans according to the lessons learned from the survey:

- 1. Need to create awareness programmes regarding importance of higher education and helping them to avail various government funded scholarships. Also providing some financial assistance to some meritorious students.**
- 2. It is observed that there are many people who use wood as cooking fuel thus awareness programs regarding the ill impacts of using wood and availing LPG cylinder under government schemes like ujjala programme.**
- 3. Distribution of books and reading materials is highly appreciated and demanded hence such initiatives will have to be continued.**
- 4. Career guidance programmes and skill development programmes can be organized in order to help people to increase their employability.**
- 5. When asked about feedback and requirements, the demand for coaching institutes in the village is observed. Hence ways of providing one will have to be explored.**
- 6. It is observed that the village lacks pucca toilets, thus awareness programme regarding the Swaccha Bharat mission and provision of public toilets can be arranged.**
- 7. Majority of the sample were observed to have a bank account. It brings the necessity of programmes related to awareness about banking services, dealing with bank related frauds etc.**
- 8. Majority of the respondents do not receive a social security allowances. Hence awareness programmes regarding awareness of the government social security provisions can be organized**

with guidance regarding application, for example; application for old age pension, government health insurance, widow pension etc.

Limitations of the study:

- 1. The study was conducted under a limited time frame.**
- 2. The study was conducted with limited financial resources.**
- 3. The study selected a small sample size which reduced its significance.**
- 4. Respondent bias stands as a limitation of the study.**
- 5. Non response from respondents is one of the limitations of the study.**

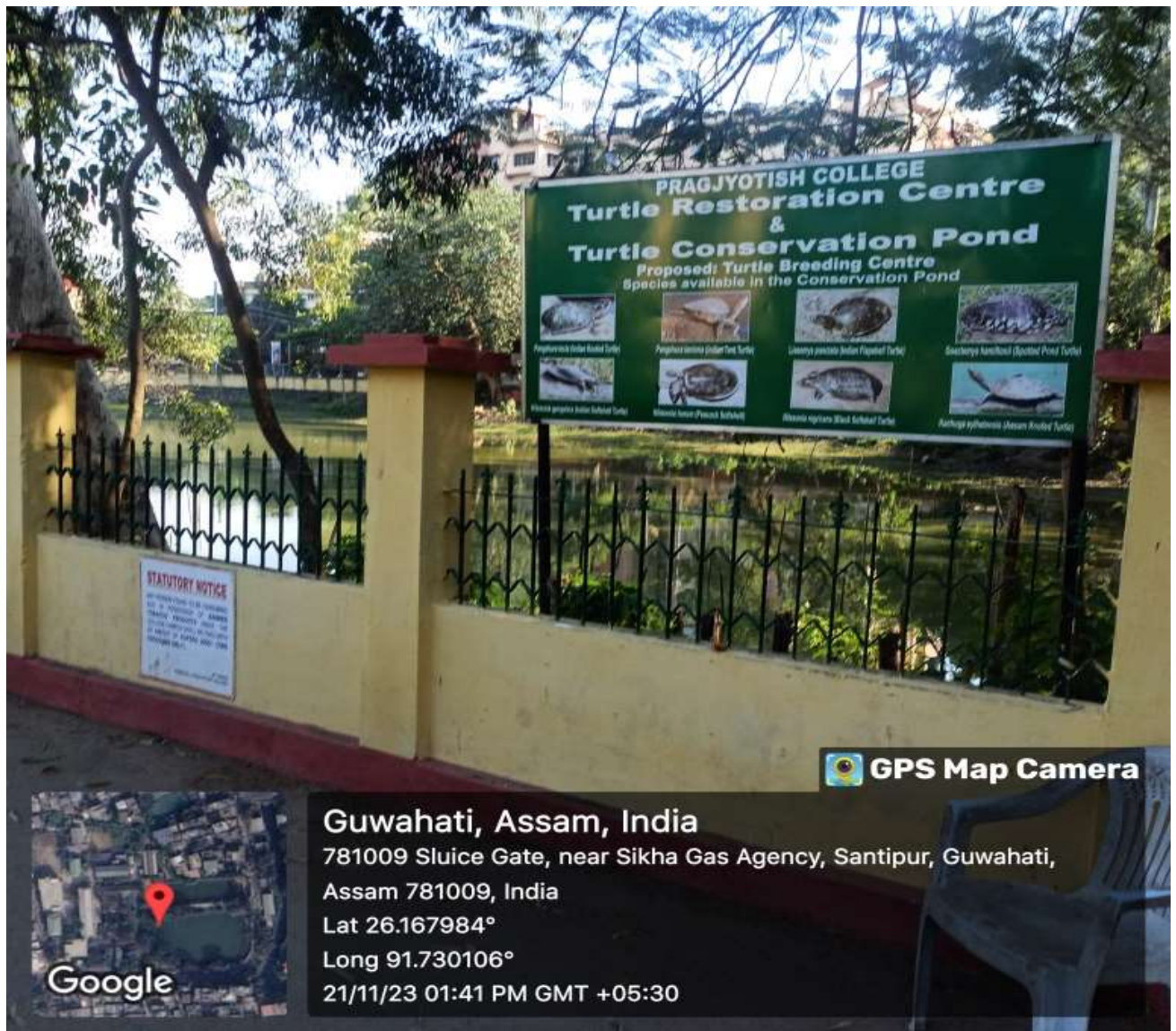

The restoration and conservation of eight turtle species, crucial for maintaining aquatic ecosystems, are milestones in the college's commitment to biodiversity preservation. The campus pond becomes a sanctuary for these remarkable creatures, contributing to broader global conservation goals.

Eight species totaling 50 individuals, ranging from vulnerable to critically endangered (IUCN-2021), find a refuge in the campus pond. The conservation status of each species is as follows:

- *Kachuga sylhetensis* (Assam Roofed Turtle): Critically Endangered



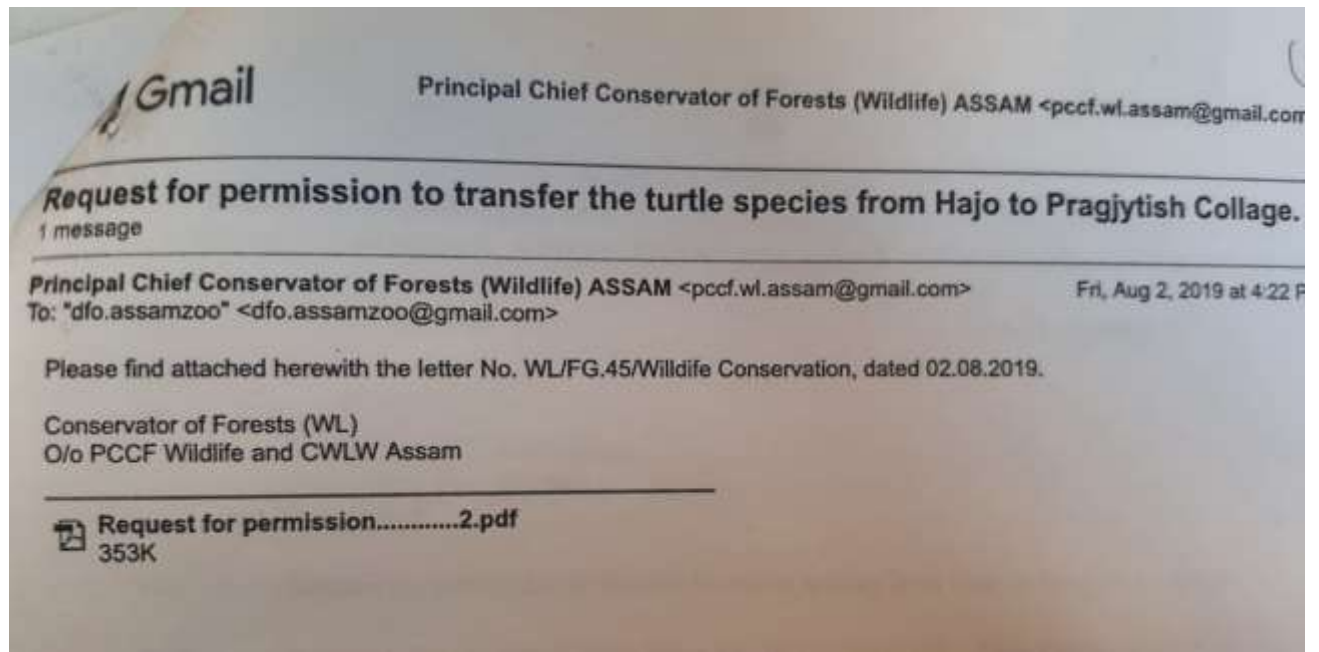
